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JOINT-Child Welfare Clinical Review	The Office of the Advocate for Children, Youth, and Families has recently begun requesting more meetings with MSHN and the CMHs relating to the Child Welfare Clinical Review process (see the review process pdf in Box). The meetings are a clinical review with various involved agencies, including child protective services, for example. It has not been called this by MDHHS, but the meetings “feel” like state level wraparound. MSHN would like to determine the primary contact from each CMH who will be their point person.

	Questions about CCI for a child with IDD and services that could be provided by the CCI. CMHs are not child placing agencies and are not placing children in a CCI. How are these homes identified that are exclusive for children with IDD? Medicaid does not pay for room and board. It has been thought that CMHs could not provide services to a child in a CCI. Is the state considering the use of CCIs for respite or short-term crisis respite? It appears the state is broadening the definition of a CCI. There are concerns with this related to HCBS requirements and things like BTP. CCI services have tended to be more restrictive.

UM- Dual Eligible Consumers referred for hospitalization	CMHs are not finding out that consumers are being referred to a placement and by the time the Medicare days are exhausted, the CMH could be responsible for quite a large bill after the fact.
