<p>JOINT – FY25 Planning Discussion for BHHs and CCBHCs</p>	<p>Additional funding has been requested by MDHHS for expansion of CCBHCs for FY25 (Cohort 3). Funding has not been approved yet, however MDHHS is tentatively planning for expansion pending budget approval. BHHs are available in MSHN region for applications on a rolling basis. Skye will follow up with MDHHS contact to determine which CCBHC certification requirements have to be fully met on 10/1/24, or where there is additional flexibility to build up to full implementation of certain requirements within 6-12 months. Will continue to have planning discussions as a region. Please reach out to Skye and the Integrated Health team if you have questions or would like to discuss either initiative more.</p>

JOINT – Bronson Behavioral Health Hospital	<p>Bronson and Acadia Healthcare have teamed up to offer a new inpatient psych facility. This new facility is located in Battle Creek and opened in July 2023. Their website is: Primary Acute Behavioral Health Hospital for Adults (bronsonbehavioralhospital.com). Katie Madden is their director of business development. They will have 93 beds when all units are open. Additionally, but not affiliated with Bronson, Southridge Behavioral Hospital (Southridge Behavioral Hospital Byron Center, Michigan (southridgebh.com)) will open its 96 adult and geriatric beds in 2025.</p>
