State Inpatient Facilities and IDD Population Admissions	Dr. Mellos' recent presentation to PIHP/CMHSP Directors included information that individuals with primary I/DD will not be accepted for admission to State Hospitals because Michigan does not have any designated Intermedia Care Facilities for Individuals with Intellectual Disabilities (ICF/IID). It is MDHHS' position that involuntary admission of I/DD individuals to state hospitals could be in violation of Olmstead Act. State Hospital Administration has worked with consumers/guardians to convert currently hospitalized individuals to voluntary admissions at this tir Recognition of significant gaps in acute/inpatient services for individuals with I/DD and/or complex behaviors that cannot be safely managed in the community.

1915(I) Data Upload to WSA	MSHN has created a Power BI report in testing to identify potential 1915(I) recipients and then remove individual who are already enrolled in waivers. MSHN is currently estimating approx. 6200 individuals across region. Intend distribute lists to each CMHSP for comparison with CMHSP local data. Question about housing assistance benefit through 1915(I). Clarity needed from MDHHS regarding how this service would be used. Recent 1915(I) leads meeting shared information that described housing assistance more as case management (assistance obtaining a maintaining stable independent housing) rather than monetary assistance to obtain/maintain housing which is the current description in Medicaid Provider Manual.
