1	PRC in the Jail	During the month of March, 29 individuals were seen by the peer recovery coach in jail, home, or community settings. 11 people were opened to the RSAT program during the month of March, with only one individual released into the community through medical hospitalization related to an abscessed tooth resulting in sepsis. A significant increase in referrals to primary care providers was noted during this reporting period, perhaps due to increased awareness of physical health needs. While not a specific goal of this program, one of the individuals obtained their GED while in jail. Previously, inmates were not allowed to test in the jail. The RSAT team was able to successfully assist a participant in a sentencing change for residential substance use treatment that would be more appropriate for their mental health needs following a psychiatric hospitalization.

1	Street Medicine Program Development	During the past month, the provider focused on initial program setup and infrastructure development. Key activities included beginning outreach to healthcare and community partners, identifying priority organizations for collaboration, and developing a workplan to guide partnership development, training implementation, and future street medicine planning. They also posted a job opening for a Public Health Strategy & Training Specialist, a critical role to support trainings, partnership development, and program implementation. Initial planning for training content and referral pathway development was also initiated. They have also been looking for office space within the Saginaw and Bay communities to help this project as well as the existing harm reduction team.
