TIME-SENSITIVE! LARA WEBINAR ON RULE CHANGES: Thursday, December 9, 2021 from 10-11:30am (*link below*)

As many will recall, Michigan's Licensing and Regulatory Agency (LARA) has been revising the administrative rules in a staged process that started under the Governor Snyder administration. MSHN and the other PIHP's SUD Directors have met to distill questions and concerns regarding the proposed changes which are available to view <u>here</u>.

LARA will host a webinar this week for programs and individuals impacted by administrative rules for Substance Use Disorder (SUD) Programs. The webinar will explain the proposed changes to the SUD administrative rules, answer submitted questions, and, time permitting, take additional questions.

SAVE THE DATE! Seeking Safety 1.5-Day Training with Dr. Lisa Najavits, March 8-9, 2022

Lisa M. Najavits, PhD, was faculty at Harvard Medical School for 25 years and is currently Director of <u>Treatment Innovations</u>. Her major clinical and research interests are substance abuse, trauma, co-morbidity, behavioral addictions, veterans' mental health, community-based care,

development of new psychotherapies, and outcome research.

She's authored over 200 professional publications, including Seeking Safety which represents the first empirically studied, integrative, evidence-based treatment approach developed specifically for cooccurring disorders, PTSD, and substance use disorders and assists traumatized individuals in learning "safe coping skills," and in restoring self-respect, care, protection, and healing. GAMBLING DISORDER TRAINING (& Reimbursement) in JANUARY 2022!

A rise in the prevalence of gambling disorder (GD) during the pandemic has fueled a MSHN goal to build clinical capacity to support individuals with GD that often co-occurs with SUD. MDHHS has partnered with the Gambling Treatment Program to support the 30-hour Gambling Training. This training covers the basics of gambling and gambling disorder, gambling disorder among special populations, the new and ever-changing world of online gambling and gaming, and basic treatment methods to work with gamblers. The training includes 9 modules reviewed by a trained GD clinician.

The training is free, but MSHN recognizes that there's a hidden cost to clinicians' training spending time away from billable services. Therefore, MSHN is offering \$75 per hour reimbursement for the 30-hours of training up to a maximum of \$2,250 per clinician upon completion of the training. Clinicians with master's level degrees and licensure are eligible for this training. MSHN is hoping to begin building capacity by supporting at least 10 clinicians from the region at this time.

PROVIDER NETWORK STABILIZATION PLAN: Extended into FY22

Early on in the pandemic, in Spring 2020, MSHN established a framework to extend support and stabilization payments to COVID-impacted regional providers. Previously issued guidance about stabilization funding is on MSHN's website <u>here</u> and has been disseminated in previous newsletters. While several providers accessed these funds, others have recently shared financial stressors related to staffing, overtime, inflationary costs, PPE, and loss of revenue.

As announced previously, in an effort to provide continuing support to the provider network, provider stabilization funds have been extended through FY22. Details can be accessed <u>here</u>.

While the deadline to submit FY21 requests was November 12, 2021, requests submitted by December 15, 2021 will be considered for FY21 stabilization funding.
