
Rising Methamphetamine Use and the Overdose Epidemic

Overdose Deaths in America (the parallel epidemic):


- April 2019-April 2020 (pre-pandemic OD deaths):
 - ▶ Up 29% to 78,056
- April 2020-April 2021 (during COVID OD deaths):
 - ▶ Up another 28% to 100,000+

The 3 Waves of Opioid OD Deaths


- Over-prescribed & diverted prescription opioids
- 2. Heroin
- Synthetic opioids (especially fentanyl)

The 4th Wave & Stimulants: (methamphetamine & cocaine)

- Opioid OD deaths w. cocaine and/or methamphetamine grew 529% from 2015 to 2017
- Meth use increasingly found overlapping with fentanyl (2013-2019 fentanyl-positive screens increased 1280%)
- Cocaine use increasingly found overlapping with fentanyl (2013-2018 fentanylpositive screens increased 1850%)

What is Methamphetamine (Meth)?

- ► Highly addictive stimulant Easy to produce
- Street names for meth: "chalk, ice, speed, crystal, crank & glass"
- Meth used in combination with other substances like cocaine/crack, marijuana, heroin, and alcohol
- Can be smoked, snorted, injested orally, or injected - (IV meth use increasing)








How has meth production & use changed?


- Local, small-scale meth production w. ephedrine (e.g., Sudafed). Access restricted.
- Cartels stepped in w. lab produced phenyl-2-propanone (P2P) meth More toxic neurotoxin
- Users often are unaware that fentanyl is combined with their meth





Prevalence of Meth Use

- 1. COVID parallels rise in meth use
- Per SAMHSA:
 - ▶ About 2 million people 12 years or older use meth in any given year
 - ▶ About 500 people each day try meth for the first time
- 3. In 2020, 2.5 million Americans aged 12 or older reported having used methamphetamine in the past year
- 4. User profile is evolving and is more diverse
- 5. No MAT for stimulants (for craving, withdrawal, overdose reversal)





Methamphetamine Psychosis (MAP)

- MAP is when meth intoxication includes psychiatric symptoms like hallucinations, paranoia, severe depression, suicidality & anxiety.
- Symptoms usually resolve within a month after meth use stops
- ▶ 10-28% experience MAP after 6+ months of abstinence
- ▶ 5-7% experience MAP even during long-term abstinence
- Where to place individuals w. MAP is a challenge:
 - ▶ SUD Providers not used to psychotic behaviors
 - Drug-induced psychosis doesn't meet eligibility for inpatient psych units
 - Contributing to homelessness



MSHN Strategies

- Developing a clinical practice guideline for MAP
- Engaging with substance use prevention coalitions
- SOR 2 expands from just opioids to include stimulants
- ► Pilot of Contingency Management in recovery homes (Newaygo & Montcalm counties)
- Working on education, training, stigma reduction and continuity of care
