# State Opioid Response (SOR) Grant


- ▶ Funding to support opioid-related prevention activities and increase access to SUD treatment services and supports for OUD
  - ▶ Mobile Care Unit
  - ▶ Jail-Based MAT
  - ▶ SBIRT in EDs
  - ▶ Overdose Education & Harm Reduction
  - ▶ Prevention Programming (Prime for Life)

# State Opioid Response (SOR) Grant

- ▶ SOR-2 supports both Opioid Use Disorder & Stimulant Use Disorder
- ▶ Last day of SOR-2 is 9/29/22 (not the 30th)
- ▶ SOR-3 to begin on 10/1/22
  - ▶ Funding priorities unknown at present.
  - ▶ OROSC is indicating they are advocating for similar to SOR2.

# COVID Emergency Funding

- ▶ Two-year grant: April 1, 2021 - March 31, 2023

# American Rescue Plan (ARP) Funding

- ▶ Four-year grant: \*October 1, 2022-September 30, 2025
- ▶ Prevention
  - ▶ Student Assistance Programming (SAP)
  - ▶ Prime for Life & Other EBPs
- ▶ Treatment
  - ▶ Staffing Support
  - ▶ Access to behavioral health supports/services for the African American Community

# FY23 SUD Treatment & Recovery Annual Plans

# Purpose

- ▶ Annual plan meetings provide MSHN Treatment Specialists with the opportunity to:
  - ▶ Discuss your agency's goals for the upcoming fiscal year
  - ▶ Provide an opportunity for the provider to share successes or innovative ideas
  - ▶ Hear about challenges and support needs
  - ▶ Opportunities for technical assistance
  - ▶ Support relationship building between the provider and MSHN
- ▶ Annual Plans are completed during a collaborative meeting between the provider agency and the treatment specialists who support the agency. Some meetings may also be supported with Utilization Management specialists as well.

# Process

- ▶ The agency's lead treatment specialist will reach out and provide FY23 annual plan documents and information individualized to each agency.
- ▶ Meetings will be completed using the Zoom platform
- ▶ The annual plan document will be completed by your treatment specialist the day of the meeting
- ▶ Please review the annual plan documents and be prepared to discuss the items applicable to your agency.
- ▶ There is no need to complete the document prior to the meeting
- ▶ Please be prepared to share progress on the DDCAT and Trauma goals identified during the FY22 annual plan process.

  - Residential and Withdrawal Management

# Timeframe

## ▶ March

- ▶ Provider will receive an email with FY23 annual plan documents and request dates and times they are available to meet
- ▶ Treatment Specialist will schedule annual plan meeting and provide a Zoom meeting invite.

## ▶ April-May

- ▶ Annual Plan meetings will take place
- ▶ Annual Plans will be finalized and placed in the “Annual Plan” folder in BOX for each provider

## ▶ June

- ▶ Cost Reimbursed budget requests are due COB 6/1/2022

- ▶ Please submit budget(s) early if they are prepared



# Timeframe Continued

## ▶ June

- ▶ Cost Reimbursed Budgets will be reviewed
- ▶ Questions regarding the budget will be shared with the provider

## ▶ July

- ▶ Treatment Team makes FY23 contract recommendations

## ▶ August

- ▶ FY23 Contract recommendations supported by PA2 funding go before Oversight Policy Board (OPB) for review and approval/denial.
- ▶ Items approved will move to MSHN Board of Directors (BOD) for final review of approval/denial.

## ▶ September

- ▶ FY23 Contract recommendations go before MSHN Board of Directions (BOD)
- ▶ If approved, MSHN Contract Manager, Kyle Jaskulka, will send contracts to providers.
- ▶ If denied, MSHN treatment specialist would be in contact and follow-up

# Michigan Opioid Collaborative (MOC)

- ▶ Initiative is through U of M's anesthesiology department funded by MDHHS, SAMHSA, and BCBSM
- ▶ Offers free support to providers treating patients with substance use disorders (SUDs).
- ▶ Provides services such as: Same-day consultations about patient issues and questions; assistance with community SUD referrals and resources; training and education around different topics related to general addiction treatment.


- ▶ TWO NEW INITIATIVES within the MOC:

# We Treat HEP C

- ▶ (MDHHS) launched the We Treat Hep C Initiative on April 1, 2021 as a key strategy to eliminate hepatitis C virus (HCV) as a health threat to Michiganders.
- ▶ April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2021, Michigan Medicaid announced the removal of the prior authorization requirements for the Hepatitis C treatment medication MAVYRET (NO copay). Can cure HEP C in 8-12 weeks.
- ▶ Michigan Medicaid/Healthy Michigan recipients may now start treatment the same day as their diagnosis.
- ▶ MOC/MDHHS has expanded services to include HCV treatment support, including HCV case review and conferencing.
- ▶ The We Treat Hep C Initiative aims to make treatment more accessible by removing barriers to prescribing.



# We Treat HEP C



- ▶ With the removal of criteria surrounding who can prescribe HCV medication, MOC/MDHHS needs prescribers (MDs, DOs, NPs, PAs) to join MDHHS' HCV elimination efforts.
- ▶ Providers with prescriptive authority are the key to this cure.

## ▶ [Syringe Services Programs interactive map](#)

- ▶ The local SSP will work with individuals to get enough syringes and injecting equipment to last 2 to 4 weeks.
- ▶ SSPs offer harm reduction to injecting drug users, often infected with HCV during needle sharing.
