	 The Regional Consumer Advisory Council (RCAC) meeting snapshot for February 14, 2025 was approved. Follow-up agenda items: None
	 The current agenda was reviewed and approved.
	 Rusmira Bektas [MSHN] provided an update on the MSHN Access implementation. She reported that the implementation was going well. MSHN is continuing to improve the Access process by working to identify a phone company that meets MSHN's desire for adequate call volume data, streamlining the process and communication for recovery housing referrals, and onboarding the Protocall company as an after-hours service to allow access for individuals seeking services.
	Amy Dillon & Bria Perkins [MSHN] provided an overview of MSHN's FY24 Monitoring Activities. They reported that their team reviews Community Mental Health and Substance Use Disorder providers. They review various required items, including staff qualifications, verification that the services billed were provided correctly, that programs meet Medicaid requirements, and that providers have the necessary standards written in their policies and procedures. The team issues a final report to each reviewed provider highlighting strengths, areas for improvement, and required corrective actions. The reviews help to ensure providers use Medicaid funding properly.
	Dan Dedloff [MSHN] reviewed the results of the MSHN Councils and Committees Satisfaction Surveys for the RCAC. The results indicated that those who responded agreed that the RCAC fulfilled its intended purpose. Members reported that the RCAC helps them learn more about the discussed topics. Feedback was given that RCAC should provide more opportunities for advocacy work. Overall, the results and feedback were positive.
	Dan Dedloff [MSHN] shared a draft summary of RCAC activities being prepared for the MSHN Board. The summary included an overview of the RCAC's role and the tasks and accomplishments since the beginning of FY24. Members discussed the draft summary and agreed that it captured their work as primary and secondary consumers, providing feedback to help the MSHN board and staff with strategic planning, advocacy, and service implementation for the MSHN region.
	 Updates The MSHN Board Newsletter was provided to members for updates on regional initiatives. An update on Conflict-Free Access and Planning occurred, and it was reported that little has occurred since the last meeting. PHIPs continue to wait for MDHHS to provide guidance. MSHN has worked on possible plans for when MDHHS provides guidance. It was reported that MDHHS has proposed a PIHP Competitive Procurement process. It is unknown what the process will look like, but updates will be provided as more information becomes available on the procurement process.
