Reduce prescription and over-the-counter drug abuse, including opiates	51 programs with multiple activities provide education/information on opioid misuse: prescription drug awareness, etc. In addition, twenty-two naloxone/Narcan presentations were provided in the community during this period. 944 activities to provide peer recovery support/education were held this quarter.
Reduce youth access to tobacco	7 programs with over 160+ activities provide education/information on tobacco and OEND misuse that were conducted for parents and community members. 38 programs with multiple activities provide education/information to youth across the entire region. DYTUR/SYNAR Coordinators worked to update MRL (Master Retail List) in this time frame (1600+). My Life My Quit (web-based media campaign for vape education) conducted in this time frame.
Reduce Substance Use in Older Adults	Saginaw and Huron counties conducted senior activity in the first quarter. In addition, Wellness Initiative for Senior Education (WISE) sessions were held in Ingham County. Hosted Chronic Pain Path (TOT) for interested providers (however interested Providers will work with MSU Extension staff to conduct further training.

TREATMENT GOALS	RESULTS & PROGRESS
Increase women's specialty service programs	MSHN has retained all contracted designated and enhanced Womens' Specialty providers during this quarter. MSHN continues to facilitate the Women's Specialty Task Team on a quarterly basis and the workgroup has begun working on further developing the Provider Needs Assessment tool used for both parents and children when entering treatment services.
Increase array of medication assisted treatment programs	Lifeways is working toward becoming the newest Office-Based Opioid Treatment (OBOT) provider in the MSHN region. Samaritas has been selected as a result of the MSHN RFP for Montcalm County and will be adding OBOT services in Montcalm County in FY23. An OBOT is a provider that offers office-based medication assisted treatment for opioid use disorders (OUD) including buprenorphine (and naltrexone) but not methadone.
Expand Stimulant Use Disorder Treatment	The treatment team is working with 2 providers to explore implementation of Contingency Management programs at 3 new(er) locations. Contingency Management is an evidence-based practice that is based on the principle that if a good behavior is rewarded it is more likely to be repeated. Contingency Management programs reward the client for things such as attending treatment or producing a negative urine drug screen. The reward motivates the individual to continue that behavior and be successful in recovery.
Expand Jail Based Serivces	MSHN continues to be supportive of jail-based services, including Medication Assisted Treatment services within the jail. Recovery Pathways is working with the Saginaw and Arenac County Jails to gain entry to the jail to begin to provide services. Arbor Circle is scheduled to begin Jail-Based services in Quarter Three in Newaygo County offering Naltrexone as well as treatment services.
Expand Trauma Informed Care	MSHN will be conducting Annual Plans next quarter and will be reviewing the Trauma Informed Organizational Self-Assessment with all providers to discuss their annual goals toward being more Trauma Informed. MSHN requires all providers to complete this self-assessment every 3 years. It is a comprehensive evaluation of the ability for the provider to accommodate and treat individuals that have experienced trauma. MSHN continues to support and require that all providers be trauma sensitive and provide trauma informed treatment services.
Expand penetration rates for adolescents, older adults, and veterans/military families.	Veteran/Military: Provided services to 41 new veteran contacts during FY23 Q2. Established quarterly meetings between Veteran Navigators and the SUD social work team at the Saginaw VA. Assisted a community hospital social work team with a veteran who was an inpatient with MH/suicide crisis. Provided additional resources for the veteran and follow up connection to the VA. Collaborated with VA community care and a local provider to assist two veterans in getting approval to receive SUD medication at a local provider vs driving to the VA. Provided warm handoff connection to a veteran who was homeless, and jobless to apply for housing assistance, employment assistance and case management.

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Adolescents: MSHN currently has 13 SUD providers who are able to support ASAM 1.0 for adolescents; ATS, Arbor Circle, Catholic Human Services, FSCA (ASAM 1.0 and 2.1), CEI, GLRC (ASAM 1.0, 2.1, 2.5, 3.1 and 3.5), List, PPPS, Recovery Pathways, Harbor Hall, Saginaw Psychological, Samaritas (ASAM 1.0 and 2.1) and Wedgwood (ASAM 1.0 and 2.1).

<u>Older Adults:</u> There is no new information about services for older adults. This population continues to be served throughout the region, however, penetration rates continue to be very low.
