| 1                          | Media Campaign | Planning for Phase II of the SUD anti-stigma Celebrating Strength campaign with a 4-county expansion continued with Redhead Creative Consultancy. Discussion and planning for a Phase III expansion to MSHN's remaining 17 counties also took place, which will include two new video-stories (one in Spanish) to be developed in May. This phase was approved at the Board of Directors May meeting. |  |

| 1                          | Street Medicine Program Development         | During the past month, the provider continued to advance initial program setup and infrastructure development. Key activities included ongoing outreach to healthcare and community partners, further refinement of priority organizations for collaboration, and continued development of a work plan to guide partnership development, training implementation, and future street medicine planning. They have advanced the hiring process for the Public Health Strategy & Training Specialist position, a critical role supporting training, partnership development, and program implementation. They are actively interviewing candidates and anticipate extending an offer within the next two weeks. In addition, initial planning for training content and the development of referral pathways has continued to progress. They are also actively exploring office space options in the Saginaw and Bay communities to support this project and expand capacity for the existing harm reduction team. They also continued community engagement and collaboration efforts in Bay County. Bimonthly "Stronger Together" meetings in Bay City have provided family members and loved ones with a supportive space to build understanding of substance use and navigate local resources together. In April, they relaunched the GLBR monthly community forum, successfully re-engaging community members and increasing awareness of local programming. The forum provided an accessible space to share information on prevention, harm reduction, and recovery services, while also strengthening trust and visibility within the community. Attendees expressed strong interest in continued engagement, including requests for additional sessions and more in-depth discussions on specific topics. |  |

| 1                                    | Transportation  | The provider's transportation program hired a full-time transportation specialist. They provided 12 rides directly to residential SUD treatment, 2 to withdrawal management, 28 to MOUD services, 22 to intensive outpatient appointments, 5 to mental health counseling sessions, 2 to the Jackson Court house, and 1 ride home from residential SUD treatment after successful completion of SUD treatment. Out of 87 rides requested, they provided 72 rides.  |  |
| 2                                    | Community Recovery Initiative   | During the month of April, the provider made meaningful progress in advancing their community recovery initiative. This month marked the beginning of their formal process to develop training curricula and PowerPoint materials for their peer recovery coaches, as well as for other peer professionals across the community. These trainings are designed to strengthen peer capacity, promote consistent best practices, and support system-wide recovery efforts. They participated in a community outreach event at Michigan Center Schools. Through this outreach, they reached 120 individuals, including 10 education professionals and 110 students. During this engagement, they provided education on substance use disorder, overdose awareness, and the use of Narcan, while also sharing information on local recovery and prevention resources available within the community. This outreach served as an important opportunity to promote awareness, reduce stigma, and build connections with both youth and educators. Looking ahead, they are actively developing a plan to increase their presence at city council meetings and other local community leadership forums. This effort will support continued advocacy, community education, and collaboration with local leaders to strengthen recovery-supportive policies and practices. |  |

| 1                          | Transportation  | This past month marked the first month of implementation for the rural recovery transportation initiative. They successfully launched the program by onboarding three independent contractors in each of the three counties they serve—Huron County, Saginaw County, and Tuscola County. They also focused on outreach by promoting the program through a news interview with WNEM, a radio segment on WSGW, and distributing flyers across the counties and on social media. Additionally, they began providing transportation to individuals in rural areas, helping them access recovery meetings, events, and other supports. They also assisted two individuals in attending training where they became CCAR Recovery Coach Academy Recovery Coaches. This service is already helping reduce barriers and improve access to recovery support. |  |
