- MDHHS communications? – Steve
 - a. BH TEDS Completion rate report - Congratulations from Joe Sedlock on being above the 95% threshold in all 3 areas.
 - b. LARA License required for H2016 & T1020 – waiting for updated list that should include ERN and Consumer ID as requested via email to Kathy Haines.

- c. PHE extended through Oct 15 – the required 60-day notice was not given by the federal government on Monday so it will be extended. Also the 834 redetermination dates seem to be getting changed (to be used for unwind).
 - d. Critical Incidents changes – Still planning Oct 1, 2022 start date even without complete documentation. May be result of State staff reorganization. This should be on CIO Forum agenda.
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- HSAG reviews - Still waiting for written report.
 - BH TEDS and Encounter submission. Issues at the State with producing 837 response files, but seems to be getting corrected right at the time of this meeting.
 - 1915(i) SPA checkboxes in CMH EMR. CLC has not requested update on this yet, but I expect one soon. Most are waiting for Clinical training to occur to start on this.
 - SDoH questions – Received only about 50% responses, so expect additional communication. People expressed excessive burden to begin a new project that is not a contractual requirement at this time.
 - FY23 DMC review – CEI and MSHN to discuss specifics of next year's full on-site review. The actual tool will be brought to the group for approval next month.
 - BH ADT Outbound project – Joe Sedlock commended the group on getting this completed ahead of schedule. CEI is arranging to receive BH ADTs as a separate process. Need more information from MiHIN on why these are not just part of the normal ADT messages. MSHN is working on a pilot of SUD outbound messages.
 - Please refer to the CIO forum minutes for information from this group. – Discussed COB starting in Oct, and workgroup starting to begin planning for remaining COB submission starting with FY24. EQI workgroup saying Milliman to send out encounter level data from August 3 extract, still waiting for this. Discussion about resurrecting the interoperability workgroup. Donna sent out new HIPAA rules 150 page document to the group.
 - Other – Steve indicated he was appointed to a Community Information Exchange group of 15 members and is the only mental health rep of any capacity. Starting to look at potential face to face meeting of ITC in March or April, Joanne asked who would

physically attend. Ginger asked who people use for PEN testing, she is thinking of using Michelle Drolet, founder & CEO of Towerwall

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CCBHC IT Subgroup

- Received non-Medicaid list from the department. Joanne indicated that verify that people on the list even got service at her CCBHC without ERN or Consumer ID not being provided by the State. Discrepancies are expected between this report and actual because no way for department to know all the reasons that a service might need to be non-Medicaid.

CEI asked about DCO. Right Door uses DCO for SUD and they enter data directly into the Right Door PCE system.

Mild/Moderate services present but limited at all 3 because of staffing issues.

CEI is working on quality measures, has 7 currently in place. Jill indicated the last QI meeting was cancelled so theses measures did not get discussed yet.
