



SUD Recovery Contract – FY27 Change Log

Changes Throughout

- Grammatical, punctuation, formatting, fiscal year, attachment reference, and terminology updates throughout the contract.
- Updated person-centered terminology throughout, including replacement of references to “consumer” and “client” with “individual,” and updated ASAM and MOUD terminology.

I. General Contract Summary (Pg. 10)

- Added Stop Work Order provisions allowing MSHN to suspend contract activities, issue written instructions, authorize resumption of work, and limit payment during the stop-work period.

II. Recovery Service Obligations – Access, Care & Quality (Pg. 10-20)

- Clarified REMI authorization/eligibility, priority-population and after-hours access requirements; MOUD initiation may not be delayed when clinically indicated; interim services now include overdose prevention, naloxone access, engagement supports, and referral coordination.
- Added provider appeal timeframes and quality monitoring for disparities in access, engagement, retention, and outcomes; services must reflect recovery-oriented, trauma-informed, and overdose-prevention principles.

III. Recovery Service Obligations – Credentialing & Compliance (Pg. 16-22)

- Updated initial background checks (ICHAT or similar, Michigan/National Sex Offender Registries, and MDHHS Central Registry when applicable), exclusion screening/documentation, emergency continuity requirements, and expanded audit/record-access provisions.
- Clarified site-specific Level III or higher NARR/MARR Recovery Residence certification requirements prior to service provision.

VI. Contractual Provisions – Funding & Insurance (Pg. 31-37)

- Updated federal/grant funding restrictions, including executive compensation and promotional-item limitations, and strengthened insurance requirements, including Employers Liability, Cyber/Privacy and Professional Liability coverage.

Attachment A – Statement of Work (Pg. 37-43)

- Added Annual Plan Guidelines; updated Recovery Housing access screening through REMI/MSHN review; clarified staff qualifications/training with potential recoupment for noncompliance.
- Expanded faith-based/Charitable Choice disclosure and referral requirements; added recovery-oriented, non-punitive and trauma-informed housing expectations, Non-Punitive Engagement, and language prohibiting MOUD access from being conditioned on counseling, abstinence, or negative drug screens.
- Added FY27 Reducing Health Disparities training and organizational readiness assessment requirements to support FY28 planning.

- Updated Recovery Housing performance measures as quality-improvement indicators reviewed quarterly,
- Updated FY27 attachment/reporting references and related terminology where applicable.
