- A meeting on Monday, November 25th at 2pm is scheduled to discuss the rest of the Dangling Admissions. There is interest among committee members to attend
- All communications have either been shared via email or uploaded via FTP
- CCBHC Encounters accepted with errors should be resolved this week. The State communicated with MSHN that they still needed to add qualifying CCBHC codes that had been rejected at the state level. These should clear this week.
- BH-TEDS extract reports should be fully functional now, as should BTPRC data collection
- The HSAG PMV/NAV has been received
- The Request for Proposal and FAQs for MSHN Analytics vendors are out. The workgroup will move forward after CY 24. The goal is to be prepared to receive demonstrations in January
- Healthicity has been chosen as the compliance software vendor.
- Every council and committee has sections in the QAPIP report , which is coming up for the end of the year.
- Although QIC is requesting an additional PCE users workgroup, but it is currently without solid details or expectations, which will be forthcoming along with the feasibility of the group.

✓ KEY DECISIONS

- While access to each HHAX system for EVV has been provided to Joe Wager, the system itself does not permit anyone at this time access of the payer dashboard. HHAX reports to have everyone up and fixed by the end of this week
- Notes on the CIO forum will be placed in this meeting's folder next week.
- Central reports that an individual at MSHN, Paul Duff, recommended to someone at CMHCM that utilizing text messages for formal communication is allowable. Martin Slominis expressed concern over the fact that CMHCM's Chief Medical Officer appears to have added language to their Telehealth policy that Martin said was based on that recommendation. Paul had passed along word that MDHHS (Danielle Hall) has indicated that texting and emailing are both acceptable activities to use the S-code for as long as there is engagement, and it is tied to the BHH care plan.
 - No one at MSHN appears to have indicated that this is a recommended practice, or that it should be added to policy as such.
 - There is concern from Central as to whether this constituted an implied recommendation, and whether, by answering this specific question as advised by an MDHHS employee, an MSHN employee is speaking on behalf of both or either MDHHS and/or MSHN as a department and entity.
 - There is debate among the council as to whether this should be allowable within a CMHSP, with some arguing that it's no less acceptable than sending PHI by mail, while others express concern over the absence of encryption.
 - The Privacy Rule within the Michigan Mental Health Code indicates that an individual can receive records in the manner requested, which includes unencrypted email.
 - It was agreed that just because something is allowable, that doesn't make it a best practice.
 - Martin notified Steve of his concerns; Steve and ITC will follow up.

CCBHC:

- CEI noted that a code for community health workers still needs to be created. In the behavioral health homes, S2080 is being used. For CCBHCs, Nate Derusha
